## 1 John 4:8

#### Is there a God?

- -- Some people fail to believe in God.
- Others believe mistakenly about Him.

## What about the Christian God?

- The Church believes:
- A Its God is the true God, who loves us
- **B** He is One God
- c He is three Persons and One God
  - Each Person of the Trinity is fully God
  - The Persons are distinct but never divided
  - He is the God of love and communion
  - God is good, just and merciful
  - The unity of God distinguishes Christianity from religions that believe in many gods
  - The Trinity distinguishes it from Judaism and from Islam.

#### How do we know God?

- A Through the creation
- B Through revelation:
  - First to the people of Israel
  - Then through sending His Son to be born a man (the Incarnation), thus revealing God in human flesh.

## Believing

- A It is not enough to know about God, we need a relationship with God
- **B** We can never know God fully.

### How does the Trinity affect us?

We look at an icon of the Holy Trinity. It speaks of our own relationships with each other.

#### God's love

- 1 Is free and creative
- 2 Is immeasurable and unconditional
- 3 Is unselfish
- 4 Is forgiving
- 5 Is personal
- 6 Is caring and provides for all our needs
- 7 Respects our freedom
- 8 Teaches us
- 9 Is just
- 10 Is humble and sacrificial.

### Why does God allow suffering?

- Christ on the Cross shared our suffering
- Christ is with us when we suffer
- We can use our suffering in positive ways.
